Spaying & Neutering

Why Spay/Neuter Your Pet?

- 1. The number one reason to spay or neuter your pet is that it is the biggest factor in reducing the homeless and stray pet population. Animal controls and rescues around the country are continually overwhelmed by unwanted litters of cats and dogs every month—these struggles can be easily prevented! Spay/neuter is the only permanent, 100 % effective method in reducing the unwanted and homeless cats and dogs.
- 2. Dogs and cats that are spayed/neutered live longer than their "unfixed" counterparts. Part of the reason for this is the fact that they are less likely to get in fights with other animals or stray away from home due to the lack of hormone-driven behavior. They also are less likely of developing certain types of cancers related to the reproductive system.
- 3. Spaying and neutering helps prevent unwanted behavior. In cats, the urge to "spray" is very strong in an intact animal, and neutering your pet fixes this issue the majority of the time. In dogs, it helps reduce the amount and frequency of the pet urine-marking as it reduces the assertive behavior associated with this act.
- 4. It's cheaper! The long-term costs of not spaying or neutering your pet can add up to an astronomical amount. Between unwanted litters, unwanted behavior, health issues, and fighting/aggression, the vet bills can become costly for a pet that has not been fixed.

Did you know that you should spay/neuter your rabbit, too? For many of the same reasons, rabbits become better companions once they have been spayed or neutered. Fixing your rabbit will reduce aggressive behavior (such as nipping or lunging), marking, and reduces rabbit overpopulation.
